Safety Management

Aim

The aim of safety management is to determine the existing operational workplace safety and health risks for the employees, to evaluate them and then systematically reduce them.

Assuring safety of life and health is an essential success factor for good economic middle- and long-term development of a company.

Organisations – of all sizes and branches – meet a sustainable company success when, in their company strategy they consequently take the following aspects into account:

- Customer satisfaction
- Employee satisfaction
- Environmental protection

The interest of the claimant must also be kept in mind if the aim of a company is to have longterm successful business trade.

Content

The following topics will be covered with careful attention to the integration of all relevant business areas :

Management instruments will be implemented in the area of job safety (e.g. Audits, KVP, setting objectives, individual aims, measures, internal guidelines)

Benefits

- Reduction in accidents on the job
- Reduction in accident costs
- Recognition and benefit from the improvement potential
- Increase employee motivation
- Develop and raise safety- and health- consciousness in employees, that is more self-responsibility, less control
- Early recognition and prevention of dangers e.g. Through management of near-miss accidents and unsure grasp of or handling of steps of procedure to be taken
- Identification and handling claims quickly, made-to-measure developments based on the analysis of the cause
- Increase legal safety through efficient management of legal requirements

Example: Checklist

By using a security management system, the security and health of the employees becomes a "top priority" and thereby a fixed component of the corporate management. Using the certification standards OHSAS 18001 (Occupational Health and Safety Assessment Systems) and SCC (Safety-Certificat- Contractoren) allows for clear structures and safetys to be established in the area of working safety.

Meanwhile for organisations who are active service providers for other businesses (e.g. industrial plant services, cleaning services,...) – it has become increasingly requested by the client that the service provider have a certified safety management system.

Take the initiative – build your safety management system up before your customers ask you for it. Use this as a head start against your competitors to set up a long term connection to your clients and to develop a new circle of clients.
